1 Basic Sciences. Three basic laboratory science courses from the GEP list of natural science courses. One course each from three of the following areas: Biological Sciences, Chemistry, Earth Sciences, and Physics. 12 credits.

2 Science Electives. One additional laboratory course from the GEP list of science courses. 4 credits.

3 Calculus. One course from the following list: MA 121, 131, 141, 231, 241, 242. 3-4 credits.

4 Math Electives. Two additional math or statistics courses chosen from MA 114 and above or ST 301 and above. One of the courses must be selected from the GEP Mathematical Sciences list. 6 to 8 credits

5 Literature. 7 Writing and Speaking. One course in advanced writing (ENG 201, 215, 272, 287, 288, 289, 323, 331, 332, 333), speech (COM 110, 112, 146, 211), or a 200-level foreign language course. 3 credits.

8 History Breadth Courses

GRP A: Two courses at the HI 2xx or HI 3xx level (excluding HI 300). At least one of the courses MUST be at the 200 level.

One of the two courses in ASIA/AFRICA/LATIN AMERICA (AFS 275, AFS 276, HI 215, HI 216, HI 263, HI264, HI 270, HI 275, HI 276).

One of the two courses in WORLD history (HI 207, HI 214, HI 233, HI 335, HI 341).

GRP B: Two courses at the HI 2xx or HI 3xx level (excluding HI 300). At least one of the courses MUST be at the 200 level.

One of the two courses in AMERICAN history (HI 251, HI 252, HI 254, HI 320, HI 346, HI 350, HI 351, HI 354, HI 364, HI 365, HI 366, HI 372, HI 373, HI 380).

One of the two courses in EUROPEAN history (HI 205, HI 208, HI 209, HI 210, HI 221, HI 222, HI 321, HI 322, 324, 332).

Co-requisite: At least 1 of the 4 BREADTH courses must include subject matter before c. 1600 C.E./A.D; thus one of the following: 205, 207, 208, 209, 214, 215, 221, 263, 275, 276, 321, 341)

9 Philosophy. One 3-credit PHI course from the GEP Humanities list.

10 Arts and Letters. 11 History elective. 4 courses selected from HI 4xx level (excluding HI 491).

12 Advanced Science / Technology Option. 15 credits. Advised list of courses (preferably a Science/Technology minor) approved by advisor and CHASS Associate Dean. Science/Technology courses used to satisfy other requirements may not be used to satisfy Advanced Science / Technology requirements. Students must earn a grade of C- or higher in all courses used to satisfy this requirement.

13 Free Elective. Twelve hours of free electives may be taken for credit only.

14 Residency Requirement: A minimum of 18 hours in the major at NC State. Fifteen (15) of the 18 hours must be at the 400 level and must include at least one 491 seminar.

15 Grade Point Average Requirement: A minimum GPA of 2.0 overall and in the major is required for graduation.
