**Major/Program Footnotes:** Please consult the CHASS Key Points and the “Handbook for Foreign Language Majors” and the Degree Audits for detailed information.

1. **History I:** One 3-credit course required from the College-approved History-I course list (a 200-level survey course covering a culture significantly different from our own, i.e., ancient or non-Western)
2. **History II:** One 3-credit course required from the College-approved History-II course list (a 200-level survey course covering a culture covering our own or a similar culture, i.e., United States or other Western Culture)
3. **Literature I:** One 3-credit hour course required from the College-approved Literature I list (a survey course covering literature outside the U.S. and prior to the 20th century)
4. **Literature II:** One 3-credit hour course required from the College-approved Literature II list (any course that meets Literature I requirement; or a course in American or Twentieth Century Literature, or an upper division survey course or literature course in period, genre, or a major figure in English, a foreign language in English translation, or the original foreign language)
5. **Philosophy:** Any PHI course on the approved GEP Humanities list
6. **Arts and Letters:** One 3-credit hour course is required from the College-approved Arts & Letters course list.
7. **Social Sciences:** Twelve (12) credit hours, selected from College-approved list, required from three different disciplines, six(6) must be on GEP-Social Sciences list.
8. **Foreign Language:** Completion of FLx 201, or comparable proficiency as demonstrated by examination.
9. **Free Electives:** Maximum 12 credit hours of free electives may be taken for credit only (S/U).
10. **Language & Culture Core:** Department approved courses with a primary focus on Chinese language, culture and civilization. Please consult degree requirements for the list of course options. 12 credit hours.
11. **300-Level Advised Elective** Choose one course from the department/program approved list. Please consult degree requirements for the list of course options.
12. **400-Level Advised Elective** Choose one course from the department/program approved list. Please consult degree requirements for the list of course options.
13. **Additional Advised Elective** Choose one additional course in your area of interest. Please consult degree requirements for the list of course options. 3 credit hours.
14. All Education students must pass the Praxis II Subject Area Tests.
15. **Study Abroad/Internship Abroad** It is strongly recommended that students participate in at least one study abroad experience to a French-speaking country. Please note that no more than 15 hours of transfer credit (from a non-NCSU program) may be applied towards the major. NCSU sponsored programs count as regular coursework.
16. **Professional Education Component:** A grade of **C** or above is required for these courses. ED/FL 299 field work is taken the semester after Introduction to 21<sup>st</sup> Century Teaching (ED 204 and ECI 204).
17. **Admission to Candidacy and Professional Year:** All FLL Education candidates must be admitted to candidacy by the beginning of the fall semester of Methods Course. All required coursework should be completed prior to student teaching.
18. **Major Residency Requirements** See departmental advisor.
19. **Grade Point Average (GPA) Requirements:** See departmental advisor for information. Although the university requirement for graduation is 2.0, a cumulative 2.75 GPA is required for each gateway: admission to candidacy, admission to professional semester, and to apply for a teaching license.
